



Sport Premium Update – Impact of 2013-2014 funding

At Windmill Hill Primary School, the Government Sports Premium is being spent to develop a broad, balanced and high quality P.E. curriculum which gives our children the opportunity to receive quality first teaching in P.E. along with the opportunity to participate in a wide variety of extra-curricular activities and attend intra-school competitions.
